CANADA IS ON LIFE-SUPPORT WITH NO PLAN FOR AN ECONOMIC RECOVERY

Canada is falling behind! We now have the highest unemployment in the G7, are the only G7 country to lose its AAA credit rating and we are the only G7 country without a recovery plan.

The current measures are only aimed at keeping the economy on life support and the Liberal government has no plan to restart the economy.

Prime Minister Justin Trudeau has tabled his *Economic and Fiscal 'Snapshot'* which confirms that the Liberal government is running a deficit of \$343.2 Billion this year, and for the first time the net federal debt will reach over \$1-Trillion this year. The federal debt has almost doubled in the last five years.

Unlike in previous years, the government has refused to provide a 5-year forecast which proves Justin Trudeau has no plan to help Canada get back to work or to restart our economy.

Throughout the pandemic, Justin Trudeau has either been wrong or slow to act, and his failure has cost us dearly. His sky-high taxes, wasteful spending and massive deficits put Canada in an incredibly weak position before the pandemic even began.

Canadians cannot afford for Justin Trudeau to be wrong when it comes to our economic recovery. His track record proves that he cannot be trusted to lead Canada through the recovery. Now, more than ever, Canada's Parliament should be sitting to provide the transparency and accountability that Canada needs.

In addition, as businesses reopen, workers who make between \$1,000 and \$5,000 per month would qualify for the *Back to Work Bonus*, a CERB top-up that would be gradually phased out (by 50 cents for every extra dollar earned over \$1,000).

Conservatives know that to be competitive, we need to unleash the power of the private sector and help Canadians get back to work. We need to support small businesses, lower taxes, cut red tape and make Canada an attractive place to do business once again. We need to compete against other nations looking to recover their economies.


To generate the revenue for the recovery and to pay down the massive debt, we will need to responsibly manage our natural resources.


