

s part of my pledge to represent your views in Parliament, I have regularly consulted with you on important issues through my community mailings and online surveys.

A mail-in survey was sent to all households asking what issues you would like to see Parliament focus on more and what issues you would like to see Parliament focus on less.

This feedback, along with the hundreds of letters and thousands of emails, helps me to better represent the community — even if it is not always in line with my party's position.

The top five issues the community wants Parliament to <u>focus on more</u> are:

- Getting Pipelines Built (52%)
- Reduce Government Spending (50%)
- Fighting Climate Change (39%)
- Unemployment (34%)
- Spending more on Healthcare (32%)

On the other hand, the five issues the community wants Parliament to <u>focus</u> on less are:

- Increasing Gun Control (54%)
- Foreign Aid Spending (52%)

- Increasing Immigration (51%)
- Fighting Climate Change (42%)
- Drug Decriminalization (40%)

It was clear that there was a stark polarization of political views on a number of issues, but when the results are combined, a consensus seem to form around a few issues with Unemployment, Reducing Government Spending, Reducing Child Poverty, Spending more on Healthcare and Getting Pipelines Built being the most important; and Foreign Aid Spending, Increasing Immigration, Increasing Gun Control and Drug Decriminalization being the least important.

Thank you to everyone who participated. Your participation greatly influences how you are represented in Parliament.





#### 2020 Community Survey Results

For the third year in a row, I received a record number of replies to my annual Community Survey.

A copy of this survey was mailed to all households in the Calgary Confederation riding and the results are accurate to within +/-2.9% 19 times out of 20.

It is worth noting that with a margin of error of +/-2.9% many of the issues are statistically tied.

#### WHEN WILL YOU GET YOUR VACCINE?

Prime Minister Justin Trudeau and his Liberal government are responsible for the purchase of all vaccines. Once a vaccine is delivered to Canada, the federal government distributes them to the provinces for local administration. So far, the difficulties in getting Canadians vaccinated has been the result of the federal government failing to import enough vaccines in a timely fashion.

More information on Alberta's vaccine distribution plan is available at www.alberta.ca/covid19-vaccine.aspx. This Spring it is the intention of the Government of Alberta to vaccinate everyone over 75 years of age and all those aged 65 and older living in a First Nations community or Metis Settlement. Later this Spring, additional targeted populations will be announced.

Provincial plans are subject to change if the federal government fails to provide enough vaccines.

### **A SHOCKING RESULT**

was proud to co-sponsor my Conservative colleague MP Scot Davidson's Bill C-204, which would prohibit the exportation of plastic waste for final disposal from Canada to foreign countries. It's time we deal with our own waste instead of using the rest of the world as a dumping ground.

Imagine my shock when the Liberal government voted against this legislation. Thankfully the Conservative Bill was also supported by the other parties in the House and will proceed to Committee for further study.

In spite of environmental concerns, use of plastics increases annually. Recycling has failed to keep 90% of our plastics from our landfills and our

environment. Dumping it in other nations is not a solution either. The Liberal government has talked a good game on the environment, but do not back up those promises with concrete actions.

The Liberal government promised in the last election that they would ban some single-use plastics in 2021. However, there is no indication they will table the required legislation soon so that it has time to be properly debated and passed this year — likely another broken promise.

There is no question all Canadians support policies that will ensure clean land, clean air and clean water. What Canadians don't support are governments that promise one thing and do another.




