
What is Bill C-210?

Bill C-210 would allow Canadians to register as organ and tissue donors through their annual tax return. It's as simple as that!

The information would then be passed to provincial and territorial governments where the taxpayer lives so that it can be added to provincial or territorial registries.

The information would be updated each time a tax return is filed.

Organ donation from one person can save the lives of up to eight people. A single tissue donor can improve the lives of up to 75 people.




Bill C-210 was introduced by Len Webber, the Member of Parliament for Calgary Confederation. It enjoys support from members of all political parties.

Its passage into law is NOT guaranteed.

We need Members of Parliament to support Bill C-210 so that we can save the lives of more Canadians.



- ✓ The annual tax return is completed every year by almost every Canadian
- ✓ The annual tax return reaches the most potential donors at the lowest cost
- ✓ The annual tax return is a legally-binding, annually updated document
- ✓ Federal, provincial and territorial governments already share critical information gathered on tax returns
- ✓ There is no need to create new and expensive computer and database systems as the existing IT system will do the job
- ✓ Existing and proven privacy and information sharing agreements will continue to protect Canadians
- ✓ It’s convenient for potential donors
- ✓ Constitutionally, it respects provincial jurisdiction because the information is passed to the provinces and territories which also avoids duplication

Why not just use Driver’s Licences?

The percentage of Canadians with a driver’s licence is dropping in every age category. Young Canadians are our future donors and have the healthiest organs.

Only 69% of 19 year-olds have a driver’s licence and this is a 20% drop from the previous generation. There is a whopping 47% decline in licensed drivers when comparing 16 year-olds today and a generation ago.



How you can help ensure C-210 passes

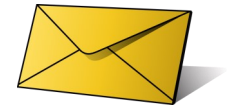


As a Member of Parliament, let your constituents know you want them to show their support for Bill C-210.
