

s part of my pledge to represent your views in Parliament, I regularly consult with you on important issues through my community mailings and online surveys.

A mail-in survey was sent to all households asking which issues you would like to see Parliament focus on more and which issues you would like to see Parliament focus on less.

This feedback, along with the hundreds of letters and thousands of emails, helps me to better represent the community — even if it is not always in line with my party's position.

The top five issues the community wants Parliament to <u>focus on more</u> are:

- Cost-of-Living Issues (61%)
- Reduce Gov't Spending (55%)
- Getting Pipelines Built (43%)
- Housing Costs (35%)
- The Environment (34%)

On the other hand, the five issues the community wants Parliament to <u>focus</u> <u>on less</u> are:

- Increasing Immigration (66%)
- Indigenous Reconciliation (54%)

- Firearms Restrictions (51%)
- The Environment (35%)
- Addressing Hate & Intolerance (33%)

It was clear that there was a stark polarization of political views on a few issues, but when the results are combined, a consensus seem to form around a few issues with the most important being:

- Cost-of-Living Issues
- Reduce Gov't Spending
- Housing Costs

And the <u>least important</u> being:

- Increasing Immigration
- Indigenous Reconciliation, and
- Firearms Restrictions




### 2023 COMMUNITY SURVEY RESULTS


Please choose the top five issues you would like to see Parliament focus on more.

### **CANADA PENSION PLAN CHANGES?**

Since 1966 the Canada Pension Plan (CPP) has reliably provided Canadians outside Quebec with guaranteed pension payments. (Quebec decided to create its own pension plan.)

I understand that for many Albertans, the Canada Pension Plan is an important part of their retirement planning. Payments from the plan are dependent on your annual contributions. The CPP currently provides an average \$772.71 monthly payment. The maximum benefit is \$1,306.57 per month.

National unity has been weakening over the last eight years, and that alienation and disrespect have played a large part the Alberta Pension Plan becoming a policy consideration. It is important that we be proud Albertans, but also proud Canadians when considering such policies.

The Government of Alberta is now considering pulling out of the CPP to create their own pension plan for Albertans.

It is important that I respect the provincial jurisdiction on these matters and allow for the Alberta government to determine the will of Albertans. The Premier has made it clear that nothing will proceed unless she has a clear public mandate to do so – and this will take considerable time.

The Premier has stated that no question will be put to Albertans until there is agreement with the federal government on the division of assets in the CPP. This may take years, especially if the matter is to be settled by the courts.

The current plan is for a vote in 2025. Any decision to leave the CPP would then require three years notice after that to come into effect.

Conservative leader Pierre Poilievre has said he would encourage Albertans to remain in the Canada Pension Plan, but it will ultimately be the decision of Albertans. Based on what I have heard from constituents so far, there is not much support for Alberta to pull out of the CPP.

It is important to remember that the CPP remains in place and will continue as normal until such time that the Government of Alberta makes a formal request to change anything.

A Conservative government will protect the CPP for all Canadians and ensure current and future retirees get their full retirement benefits.
